TEACHER NOTES

6 Questions to ask at the Isle of Wight Steam Railway





Contextual Summary

This is a English/Spoken Language task that enables students to practise their questioning and listening skills, as well as recording the information discovered. The task links to specific information about the Isle of Wight Steam Railway that should be interesting and relevant to students in key stage 1.

Questions have been chosen because they link with core English skills on the new 2014 curriculum and also specific cross-curricular skills for example in the subjects of History and Science.

Task Implementation

This task can be introduced before the visit to the Isle of Wight Steam Railway, in class, as a taster activity. Students could share their 'guesses' as to what the answers may be, as a class or in groups, and then will find out when attending the railway visit if they were accurate. Working in groups may better support lower ability students in terms of learning and understanding. Alternatively, the task can be introduced on arrival as an investigative activity to focus students' attention on key areas during their visit.

When on site, students will be able to use the questions as prompts to engage with the volunteers and information at the Isle of Wight Steam Railway in order to find the answers to their questions, gaining a more enhanced and enriched visit experience.

Ability Levels

There is one version of this resource, generally adapted for low/mid/high ability students in key stage 1. These could be adapted further by teachers if required, i.e. for SEN. For example, students could be tasked with answering fewer questions, or the ones that interest them the most, or perhaps work in teams to find the answers

Opportunities exist for the student to gain peripheral knowledge from the Q&A process; for example, in asking the questions on the resource, it is hoped that further questions will follow, and enriched understanding gained. Members of the volunteer staff at the Isle of Wight Steam Railway have a wealth of knowledge and impart this with a willing enthusiasm.

Learning Outcomes

Students will be able to demonstrate their questioning skills, by asking appropriate questions of the right people, or finding the required information. Students will also be able to demonstrate that they have listened by recording the information gleaned from the visit.
