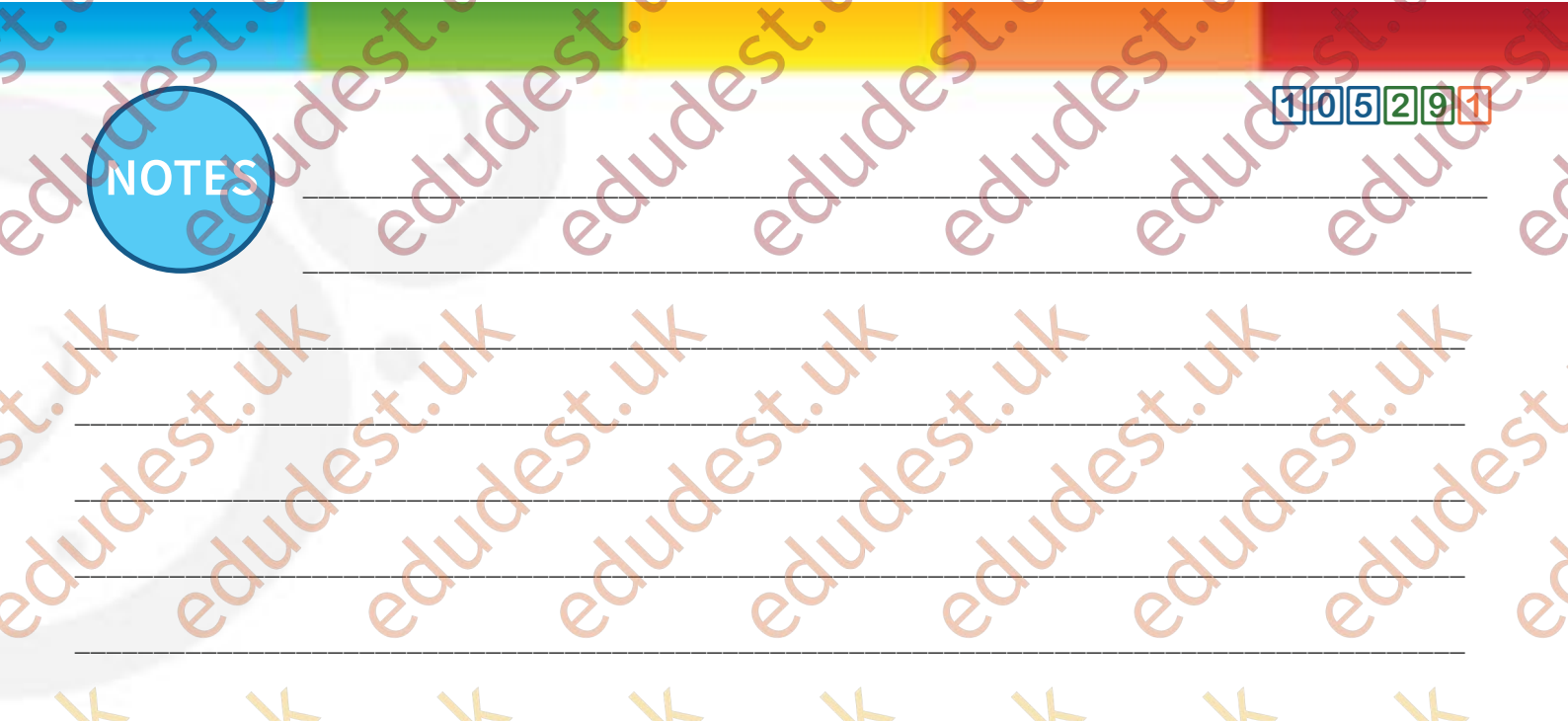

Its long legs.

Honeysuckle.

e) Which type of tree was a present from the Romans?

Sweet Chestnut.

f) Which is the largest snail found in British woodlands?

The Roman Snail.

g) Which Chinese symbol are you? Record one or two interesting facts about your symbol.

h) Which city is 209 miles from Robin Hill?

Paris.

Combley Roman Villa.
