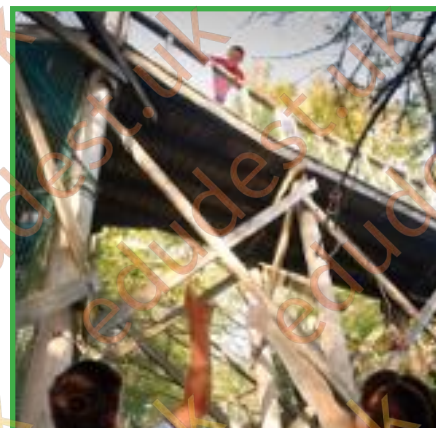


Robin Hill Guide Book Challenge!

TASK

- » You are going to write a section on Robin Hill for this guide book.
- » The first thing that you need to do is to investigate examples of persuasive writing (in your guide books) so that you can immerse yourself in the descriptive power of words. Your page will also need to show your audience how much fun (and relaxation!) they can have in an action-packed day!
- » When on-site at Robin Hill, you will need to take photographs of the theme park to show people the variety of activities in which can be experienced.
- » Remember - you have to appeal to the whole family here: whilst mum and dad want their kids to enjoy the action, there needs to be a section for them too (and we all know how much mum and dad need to relax on holiday!).
- » It is essential that you plan your page(s) carefully:
 - ✓ Which activities will you emphasise?
 - ✓ Which images will you use?
 - ✓ How will you lay out your page?
 - ✓ Can you use some of the photos which you took on your visit?
 - ✓ Don't forget to use a range of presentational features: bullet points, paragraphs, headings, a range of font types and sizes.....
