A. Look at the paragraphs.

- 1. How many paragraphs are there?
- 2. How many sentences are there in the shortest paragraphs?
- 3. Which paragraph gives details about when the park is open and its cost?
- 4. Make notes on what each paragraph is telling the reader

B. Now look at the sentences within the paragraphs.

1. Look at the first sentence. The main part of that sentence is telling us that "the Isle of Wight is the smallest county in the United Kingdom".

Write down the extra detail that has been added to this?

Notice how this extra part has been separated from the main part by a comma. This extra part does not make sense on its own. It is called a subordinate clause. Now look at the second sentence.

Can you identify the main part of the sentence?

Now write down the extra subordinate clause.

Write down the subordinate clause in paragraph 3.

2. What conjunctions can you find which connect ideas within sentences? e.g. as, but, since
