Student Introduction

- Are you good at finding out information?
- Can you research information and present it clearly?
- Now that you have been to Blackgang Chine, you will become an expert on Isle of Wight Chines!

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- 2. Firstly, find out where there are other chines on the Isle of Wight.
- 3. Use an **OS map** and give 6-figure grid-references for the chines which you manage to find.
- 4. Then you will need to find out how a chine is formed and explain it in your own words .
- 5. Use a photo to illustrate the chine for others.
- 6. Once you have your map, grid references, photographs and research, decide how to present all the information together.
- 7. You need to:
 - » Tell your reader where to find these chines (including how to get there) and describe how they were formed.
 - » Use the correct **vocabulary** (e.g.: erosion, river valleys, ravines, vegetation etc.).
- 8. Finally, include a section on SMUGGLING! Smugglers used chines on the Isle of Wight to sneak their illegal goods from their ships to dry land. There are many stories to research on this topic!
