Local History Study - Blackgang Chine

Contextual Summary

This is a post-visit history resource that engages students with their visit to Blackgang Chine Theme Park. The resource task enables them to practise their evidence collation skills as well as their writing and artistic skills.

Students are asked to work collaboratively to create a poster outlining the key history aspects of Blackgang Chine and its development, using their information gained at Blackgang Chine and the resource documents as their stimulus material.

The task has crossover elements with English. The task is designed to appeal to students in key stage 3.

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Theme Park so students are aware of the need to focus on historical aspects they may see, in order to form ideas for their response.

The tasks can be integrated into lessons at any stage. Students will produce an informative poster that gives information about the history of the park but also explains what they did there, and enjoyed.

Students break down the task into parts, decide who is going to do what, use resources (or further research on-line) to get the information they need, then produce the poster. They could use ICT if appropriate.

Ability Levels

This resource is suitable for key stage 3 students who will be able to work in mixed ability pairings or small groups. There is one mixed ability version of the resource for key stage 3; pages within the resource are designed to be accessed at different levels.

Resources 106061 and 106062 have been written for lower and upper key stage 2, and could be adapted for teachers if required, for further differentiation purposes.

Key skills practised in this unit:

- ▶ Getting information from a variety of sources
- ▶ Applying knowledge gained on the visit to explain sources
- ▶ Speaking/listening/negotiating the completion of the task.

The above skills are required to be taught and practised as per the National Curriculum, for key stage 3: History.

Learning Opportunities

Pre-Visit

- ▶ The task could be introduced in class prior to the trip so the students give some thought to what information they will need to look out for during the visit.

During the Visit

- ▶ Students may take pictures or notes, or ask questions at the park.

Post Visit

- ▶ After the visit they will give more serious study to the history and be able to use knowledge gained on the visit to place the sources into historic context.

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- ✓ Students are applying their knowledge of the park as well as the information gleaned from the sources to collate ideas and gain a cohesive understanding of Blackgang's local history.
- ✓ Collaborative skills are also being developed.
- ✓ Students could complete research at home.

Learning Outcomes

- ✓ Students will retrieve historical information from a variety of sources.
- ✓ They will demonstrate evidence of planning, collaborative group working and time management.
- ✓ Students show that they can collate evidence to produce an historical representation of the Blackgang Chine timeline and features (their historical poster).

Possible follow-up tasks:

In addition to the task detailed, students could also:

- ▶ Complete a wider history project on subjects such as the Isle of Wight smugglers, shipwrecks etc.
- ▶ Present an historical drama role play focusing on the key features of Blackgang's history.
- ▶ Produce a group 'freeze frame' of one aspect of the park.

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
