- ▶ Back at school, you will make your own Mondrian painting!



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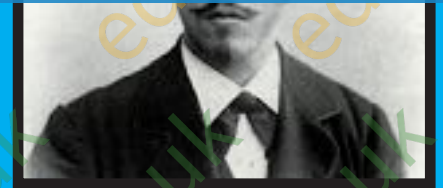
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His paintings are made up of squares, using only black lines, white, red, blue and yellow rectangles.
