- ▶ Back at school, create your own Mondrian inspired art work!



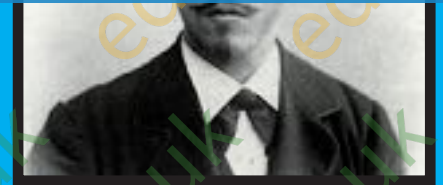
