Carousel Activity for pre visit lesson

- I. Prepare 5 x blank A2 sheets and 5 marker pens. Each sheet should have one of the following headings written on the top:
 - 1. Make a list of different sea going vessels
 - 2. List different work areas within the maritime industry
 - 3. Consider reasons for fewer women within the maritime industry
 - 4. Make a list of skills needed within the maritime industry that are more suitable for men
 - 5. Make a list of skills within the maritime industry that are more suitable for women
- II. Place each sheet and one pen on a separate table.

It may be an idea to keep the sheets turned over before starting the activity.

- III. Before they sit down, divide class into 5 groups and explain that they will have a short time to read and then write their ideas onto each sheet and that they can only move to the next station when you give the signal. A scribe could also be chosen for each group.
- IV. Allocate each group a starting station and establish the moving signal. This could be a sound or I have successfully used music to move to.
- V. The groups are given between 1 and 2 minutes to read and add their own ideas to each sheet. You can judge the appropriate amount of time for your class but don't give enough time for wasting! They are not allowed to cross out ideas from another group, only add their own ideas. See page 4 for more ideas.
- VI. When groups are back to their starting place, each sheet can be stuck to a wall with masking tape for later discussion in the plenary.

This activity should not take longer than 15 minutes.
